What is JOY?

Advent is a special time to get ready for Christmas—but not just with lights, presents, or cookies. We're getting our hearts ready too. This book will help you do that!

You might think joy means being happy or having fun—and that's part of it! But real joy is something even better. Joy is what you feel when you know you're doing what's right. It's the goodness inside you when you love God, help others, and take care of yourself.

That's why this book is all about **JOY:**

J is for Jesus

0 is for Others

Y is for You

Each day during Advent, you'll learn something simple you can do to love Jesus, care for others, and be kind to yourself. That's what brings real joy—the kind that lasts longer than any gift under the tree!

Let's get started. Christmas is coming—and so is JOY!

We find joy all through the Bible, too. In this Advent book, you'll find games, puzzles, and brain teasers that show you how to find joy in the Psalms and joy in the Gospels. When we want you to find a specific verse, we hope you have a copy of the New American Bible on hand.




Make a picture of Mary to glue to your picture. What color will she wear?

The morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy. — Job 38:7

The angels in the Bible often bring joy. We read that when God made the heavens and the earth—the first story in the Bible—the angels shouted

for joy. Why? The secret is in Genesis 1:31! That's at the end of the very first chapter of the Bible.





I proclaim to you good news of great joy. —Luke 2:10

Remember: we want to have joy with Jesus, Others, and You. Let's start with you! We just read that the angels shouted for joy as God saw that EVERYTHING that God makes is good. That means YOU! YOU...are made by God. That means you are good just the way God made you—no matter how big or small you are, no matter how fast or slow you are, no matter how

sad or happy you are.

When you know and love yourself, you learn to know and love others, too, and the whole good world that God makes. Remember the angel who brought good news to Mary? Imagine the angel came to your household to bring good news about YOU! What would the angel tell others about you?

December 6, St. Nicholas Day

I have told you this so that my joy may be in you.

—John 15:11

Today is St. Nicholas Day! The joy of St. Nicholas taught the whole Church a lesson about joy. Legend tells us that St. Nicholas loved the poor and their children most of all. This is what

the Church learned: we are to prefer the poor, too. When we share what we have and make a better world for all people, we bring joy to ourselves, to others, and to Jesus most of all.

What could change the first picture on the left for the better picture on the right? Draw or write your answer in the space below.










Can you add a favorite saint to your picture? You could choose Nicholas!

Do you ever make a list of what you want for Christmas? Make a list like that today—only don't put any "things" on it like toys. Instead, think about this: what would make Christmas morning for you? Hugging each member of your family? Singing your favorite carol? Playing with a pet or family member?

Advent joy keeps going with a man who took care of others.

Remember: loving Jesus, Others, You is how we spell JOY.

The story of Joseph is the story of a man who found joy when:

- 1. He listened to God.
- 2. He said yes to God.
- 3. He cared for others. iust as God asked.

Just as an angel came to Mary, so did an angel from God come to Joseph to tell him that Mary would have God's own son. The angel told Joseph not to be afraid but to take good care of Jesus and Marv.




Make a picture of Joseph to glue to your picture. What color is his hair? Does he have a beard?

There was no room for them. —Luke 2:7

One of the first ways Joseph had to care for his family was to travel with Mary from Nazareth, near the waters of Galilee, to a town called Bethlehem, in Judea. Even today, it takes ten days for tourists to walk as best as they

can a trail similar to what Mary and Joseph traveled. The trail today is called The Jesus Trail, and you ask an adult to read to you about it on this website: Jesustrail.com





At Bethlehem, Joseph found a cave or stable for Mary and him to rest in. Can you add one to your picture creche? You can glue a few narrow strips of paper to show the outlines of the stable.

Two are better than one. –Ecclesiastes 4:9


Remember: we want to have joy with Jesus, Others, and You. Like Joseph, let's take a look at making joy for others!

We start by learning to love the people who love and care for us—like our family and friends. Jesus is the

best teacher of love, and he helps us grow in kindness every day. As we get better at loving, we learn to care for people we don't know. And even though it's hard, with Jesus' help, we can learn to love people who are unkind to us.

So start by thinking of people you know who know how to make you feel good. Can you think of someone you trust? Can you think of more than one "someone" who loves you? The kids below are sharing 2 ideas each about things that people do to make them feel good.

There are special days for our Mother Mary during Advent. December 8th is a great feast in honor of her Immaculate Conception. But North Americans—those who live in the United States or Mexico or other parts of North America can celebrate with special affection her appearance to the poor man Juan of Guadalupe.

As Mother of the Church, Mary

teaches us always to put the poor first. In fact, when she found out she would be the mother of Jesus, she ran to her cousin Elizabeth and sang a song about the great deeds of God. Can you figure out how to read these words from the song she sang? They will tell you how God—and Mary—love the poor.

Jesus, Others, You: that makes JOY! Now look back on December 5. What did you say you would do on your best day alone? We usually know what makes us happy! But we don't always know what makes others happy—until we use our detective skills! Ask three people who you see most days, "What would make you happy this Christmas?"

Activity... Write what you find out in the detective magnifying glasses below!



Add one thing you found out to your creche. You can add someone's favorite Christmas food, or words from their favorite carol!

We come closer every day to Christmas J-O-Y, joy for Jesus, Others, You. Look at the list your made on December 7. Today you will add 3 new items to your Christmas list. Don't put any "things" on it like toys. Instead, use what you found out on December 13 to add ideas that will make Christmas

morning a good Christmas morning for others.

Maybe your dad wants help with cleaning up from Christmas breakfast. Maybe your kid brother or sister wants someone to play with. Maybe a grandparent wants a Christmas morning phone call.

Some of the "others" at the first Christmas were animals! We don't know which ones shared the stable or cave with Jesus, but there might have been goats or doves or sheep. Which animals can you cut out and glue to your creche picture? (Is your picture getting too crowded? Tape a new sheet to each side. Glue cardboard cut from empty boxes to each sheet. Now you have a 3-part creche picture that can stand up!)

For a child is born to us. —Isaiah 9:5

Remember: loving Jesus, Others, You is how we spell JOY. Let's look at ways to draw closer to Jesus!

Remember: we want to have joy with Jesus, Others, and You, Jesus had close friends who loved him and helped him—and he still has close friends today. Jesus wants to be close to each of us!


Why does coming close to Jesus bring iov to us and others? Because when we come close to Jesus, we

become more like Jesus. We become the men and women, the boys and girls, that God wants us to be.

How do you think the world would be different if everyone in it came close to Jesus? If everyone in the world loved God, themselves, and others?

In this puzzle, circle every 3rd letter in the spiral to find out how scripture says the world would be different! You'll find the answer in 1 John 3:2.






Add to your picture creche a cut out of how the world would be better if everyone came close to Jesus.

I love the LORD. —Psalm 116:1

Take a look back to December 4 and December 11. First you decided what you like to make or do: that's a joy God gives to you! Then you chose a way to share that gift with someone else on Christmas. That's a joy God gives to others through you.

Now think of a way to share your gift with Jesus on Christmas day! Whatever you decide will be your way of coming closer to Jesus. You might:

- Sing a song for Jesus on Christmas morning—whether anyone else sees you or not.
- Draw a picture for Jesus. You can place it at the family creche or wrap it up and label it for Jesus and put it under the tree.
- 3. Remember to stop three times during Christmas morning to say "Thank you!" to Jesus: for the people you love, for the gifts that make you and others happy, or for the food you like to eat.



Come to the feast. - Matthew 22:4

When we come close to Jesus, we become more like Jesus. Let's take a look at who Jesus is, and who we can

be. With a friend or family member, read the story in *Luke 9:12-17*.





Activity...

Now look at the two pictures above. With Jesus in the picture, how many things are different! Can you spot these differences?

Use your Bible to answer the questions below:

- 1. What was the problem they faced? (See Luke 9:13)
- 2. How many people were hungry? (See Luke 9:14)
- 3. How does Jesus help? (See Luke 9:16)



Jesus was born in Bethlehem, a name that means "house of bread." Can you add a cut-out picture of your family's favorite bread to your creche?

I will listen to what God, the LORD, has to say.

—Psalm 85:9

Jesus, Others, You: that makes JOY! If we learn to listen and help as Jesus does, we will know a new joy that only coming close to Jesus can give.

Let's try to learn to listen better! Who listens carefully to you? What do they do so you know they are listening?



Activity...

Now choose a time to day when you can be quiet—like a bird or mouse!—and listen to the people in your house for 15 minutes.

Write or draw your answers to these listening questions:

- Who's talking?
- Does anyone who is talking give a clue as to how they're feeling today?
- Does anyone seem to need help today?
- Is there someone who would be glad that you are listening today?




We know God always listens to us when we pray. Can you write a prayer word or sentence on your picture creche?

Joseph, to tell him to take good care of Jesus and Mary.




Activity...

When Jesus was born the sky filled with angels to bring good news to poor shepherds living outside with their sheep! Each of the shepherds hears a word. Can you unscramble the words and put them in order to hear what the angels sing?

Peace to those on whom his favor rests. —Luke 2:14

Why did the angels sing? Because they knew a great secret about the joyful birth of Jesus. The first angel told the shepherds, "I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people."

That was the secret! The joy wasn't just for the shepherds. The joy wasn't

just for Mary and Joseph. It was for all the people. The joy of Jesus is for all the people in the world today, too. When we turn to God—when you love Jesus, Others, You—you receive the joy that filled the sky with angel song so long ago.

Only 2 letters are missing, but they are missing in more than one place. Look at *Luke 2:11* for clues!



All Advent we've learned about JOY: how to love and know Jesus, Others, and You. There's one final things to know about joy. It grows when we share it! We don't give away our joy and then not have any left! No, when we share joy, there's even more joy to go around.

In Luke 2:15-20, the shepherds who hear the angels sing about Jesus decide to go see this joyful news for themselves. Imagine if they had cell phones in those days! What would they text to their friends about baby Jesus? What picture of themselves with Jesus would they take?

Activity...

In the two cell phones below, take a "selfie" with baby Jesus—one for a shepherd and one for you. Then write a message about what joy was found in the visit.


Merry Christmas!
